## Snow Day Activities and Learning Ideas.

Investigate snowflakes — can you find two that look the same? Can you remember how may sides they have? Try using a black tray or black paper and a magnifying glass if you have one. Can you have a go at drawing a snow flake?	Create snow art — you could use paint or food colouring.  Enjoy a warm drink while watching the snow fall and read your favourite stories together.	Explore making footprints in the snow and create different footprint trails. Try using shoes of different sizes and with different soles – whose is the biggest or the smallest?
Melting challenge – collect cups of snow and attempt to either stop the snow melting or make the snow melt as fast as possible.	Make snowballs of different sizes. You could attempt to build a snowball tower or throw snowballs at a target.	Instead of a mud kitchen, create a snow kitchen! Using pans, bowls, cups, spoons, whisks
Build a snowman, snow child, snow animal or snow building. (Try to find interesting things to use to dress it like – a hat, buttons, carrot, natural materials, ribbons, or spare clothing)	Try mark making or writing in and on the snow. You could use your feet, sticks, giant paintbrushes, pom-poms, or lolly sticks.	Draw a picture of someone dressed for a cold winter day and then label the clothes they are wearing to keep them warm and dry.
