Traditional Tales.

We have been busy acting out 'The Three Little Pigs' story in the puppet theatre, building different houses in construction using the vocabulary of build, taller, shorter, more and less. We have explored how to build houses using different materials and can now name a range of different materials and talk about what they may be like.

We have also been looking at weddings linked to the story of 'Cinderella'. We have really enjoyed looking at and designing wedding dresses, invitations, and cakes. We particularly enjoyed dressing up in a real-life wedding dress, bouquet and tiara and talking about all the special objects linked to weddings and what a wedding is all about. All the children loved making crowns and masks for the ball and learning some basic waltz steps.

In phonics we have been exploring what sounds we can make and following and keeping a steady rhythm and beat, exploring the different sounds of instruments and what objects we can name beginning with the sound's 's', 'a', 't', and 'p'. We have been working hard to identify lots of different instruments and environmental sounds - we have learnt lots of new names of instruments and been exploring how to segment words like a robot – or Metal Mike. As part of our literacy we have also enjoyed reading lots of rhyming stories – such as 'Oi Dog' and exploring how rhyming words can sound.

We have also been finding out about the Year of the Dragon and how people celebrate Chinese New Year. We have created Dragons in art and design – learnt about amazing Lion and Dragon dances and even created our own Dragon Dance. We have practiced calligraphy and painted the symbol of the Dragon using paintbrushes. We have been measuring dragon lengths to find the longest and shortest dragon and found out and practiced repeating patterns and shapes. We have also tasted some yummy Chinese food – noodles, vegetables, soy sauce, and sweet and sour.

We have also loved listening to a range of Traditional tales and stories and recreating them. We especially loved our Mixed-Up Fairy Tales book by Hilary Robinson and Nick Sharratt.



learning about 'Diwali' – the festival of light, 'Bonfire Night' and 'Christmas'.

We all watched videos of firework displays and talked about the different sounds the fireworks made. Some of us chose to write these words independently e.g. 'pop' 'fizz'. We discussed the importance of keeping safe around fire and fireworks. FS2 made some wonderful firework pictures using a range of materials.

We have all gained knowledge about how people around the world celebrate the Diwali. We made our own Diya lamps using clay. We also created our own rangoli patterns using loose parts. Children also enjoyed drawing rangoli patterns outdoors using chalk. We also used our class 'Light Box' to use different 2d shapes to create our own rangoli patterns.

The children focused on 'Remembrance Day' and the importance of wearing a poppy. The children were very creative in making different representations of poppies. We saw excellent drawing, painting and cutting skills displayed.

As part of our focus on 'Christmas' – we have made Christmas cards – lots of children have been independently writing their own messages in their cards using their phonics knowledge! FS2 have enjoyed a range of Christmas crafts! We have been singing songs and rehearsing for our performance of the 'Christmas Story'. We were very proud of our performance to our families. The children showed excellent concentration and were confident acting, singing and dancing. We have been learning about the story of the birth of Jesus. We have also learned about different ways people celebrate Christmas around the world – comparing them to our own traditions.

Our core texts have included the 'Owl Babies'. We have become confident re-telling this story, talking about the characters and key events in the text. We enjoyed drawing the characters and labelling them – showing good letter formation.

We are making great progress with our Phonics sessions. Lots of us can now read short words independently. We are also enjoying lots of Maths learning – we are becoming more knowledgeable each week about shape and number. We have been so impressed with the progress our children are making!











This half term, Year 1's learning has been all about "The UK'. In Geography we have been learning all about the four countries in the UK, their capital cities and their surrounding seas. We have also focussed on recognising their flags and national symbols too.

In art our focus has been developing our drawing skills. We have explored using different types of lines and mark-making techniques. We have practiced drawing with a selection of materials like pencils and chalk, and experimented with various media, while responding to music.

In computing our focus has been online--safety and using the internet. We have been discussing what the internet is and how it can be used. We have been recognising that the internet may affect mood or emotions and how internet use can affect and upset others.

In RE, we have been focusing on Christianity and how faith contribute s to Community Cohesion. We have also been learning about beliefs, ethics, family traditions and faith in the community

In music we have been focussing on developing our singing skills. We have been learning how to add rhythm and pitch to our voices. We have learnt a selection of songs through listening, singing, playing, composing and improvising and finally performing them.

YEAR 1 VISIT TO CONISBROUGH CASTLE

5 MARCH 2024

Our History learning is Towers Tunnels and Turrets. We are visiting Conisbrough Castle to learn about what is was like to live in a Castle and who lived in a castle.

YEAR 1 PARENT SESSION- TOWERS, TUNNELS AND TURRETS

12 MARCH 2024

As part of Year 1's Towers, Tunnels and Turrets learning we would like to invite you to join us for a 'Creative Castles Session'. This will give you the chance to support your child to create their own castle.

In History we have been learning about the Great Fire of London. We looked at London in the past and compared it to modern London. We found out the events of the Great Fire of London and sequenced them on a timeline. We are looking at Samuel Pepys' diary and how these historical sources help us to know about the Great Fire. We are really enjoying getting to explore this notable event and it's impact on the city of London and also our country.







In Literacy, we are currently mixing real and imaginary ideas by writing a diary from

the viewpoint of a rat in London in 1666! In our maths lessons we started the term by exploring money. We looked at coins and notes and how to make different amounts. We also tried adding money and giving change. Next, we moved on to multiplication. We have explored equal groups, repeated addition and arrays and we are doing a great job!

In science we have explored seeds and bulbs and are looking at how plants grow, what they need to grow and also where they grow. We are exploring mixed media in our art work and looking at creating textures using different techniques. We will then use these textures to create a collage.

Finally, we had an amazing day visiting the National Emergency Services Museum in Sheffield. We showed off our brilliant knowledge of the Great Fire of London, dressed up and explored lots of different emergency service vehicles. We saw modern fire engines and some very old, horse-drawn fire carts too!

Year 3 have been learning about Scotland this half term as part of their Geography work. They have looked at it as part of the United Kingdom and its position in the world as well as any physical features that can be found there such as lochs and mountains. In Science the children have been learning about light and have enjoyed using torches to explore different ideas about light and how it travels, but also how it helps us to see. It was lovely to see so many parents join us for our shadow puppet session linking with this too!

YEAR 3

NATIONAL MINING MUSEUM VISIT

1 MARCH 2024

Our learning for the spring term is all about "Mining". To support our learning we have arranged to take Year 3 children on a visit to the <u>National Coal Mining Museum on Friday 1 March 2024</u>. Here the children will have the opportunity to explore different mining exhibits and learn about mining life. They will also take part in a tour of the mine where they will experience some 'hands on' activities and areas of science.

This half term, our learning has been all about 'The Romans'. To start off our learning, we had our 'Roman History to Life' day where the children learnt all about who the Romans were,; what Roman life was like including how to speak and write in Latin; what it was like to be a Roman soldier and how the Roman army were so successful. They also learnt how to play 2 tactical Roman games. The children had the opportunity to look at various replica Roman Artifacts including a Roman oil lamp, helmet, sword and inkwell and stylus. As part of their Religious Education, Year 4 have learnt about the Bhagavad Gita, which is a special Hindu book, Hindu beliefs and how Hindu's behave towards each other. They have discussed milestones in their lives and looked at how Hindus celebrate milestones in their lives. In history, the children have learnt all about how and why the Romans successfully invaded Britain, whether or not the native Britons welcomed or resisted the Romans and why and how the Romans influenced the culture of the people already here in Briton. As part of their science lessons, the children have learnt all about electricity, including what an electrical appliance is and how to keep safe when using electrical items. The children have constructed simple series circuits that have included a variety of components. They have investigated open and closed circuits and have tested materials to see if they are conductors or insulators. A big thank you to all the parents who attended our Roman Clay Pottery session.

are as well as looking at the city states. We have begun to look at how Ancient Greece was governed and how this is similar and different to how countries are governed today. We have spent more time looking at the City states - Athens and Sparta.

During science we have looked at forces, this links with our learning on Earth and Space as we have been testing objects to find the mass and look at how it relates to newtons and gravity. We built our own parachutes and changed one of the variables. We had to make sure that it was a fair tests when we completed the task.

In PE we have looked at Fitness and Dodgeball, where the children begin to look at keeping themselves fit as well as target throwing and long distance throwing and catching.

In maths we have spent a lot of time looking at equivalent fractions and how to add and subtract them as well as simplifying them into their smallest form. We continue to spend time on our timetables to ensure we know all of the multiples and factors.

During the day, the children will investigate Greek artefacts, find out about Greek clothes, medicine, games and pottery. They will also find out about Greek children and schools and the role of girls and women. They will use the Greek alphabet to translate Greek words into English and translate the names of some Greek Gods. Finally, they will investigate what made the Classical Greeks so successful.

YEAR 5 PARENT SESSION—ESCAPE FROM HEATHER GARTH

3 MAY 2024

You will be invited to join your child for our parent session, where, with your child, you will be using a map of Heather Garth School and your child's knowledge of co-ordinates, to find the location of a series of questions. You will then need to crack the code and answer each question before you can move on to the next task. Will you make it out of Heather Garth?

In Science we have been studying Evolution and Inheritance. We have looked at how characteristics are passed on by parents to their offspring and how these vary – we don't all look the same. We identified how different animals are adapted to suit their environment and that adaptation may lead to evolution.

In Geography we have been studying Climate Change and Sustainability. We looked at different vegetation belts, climate zones and biomes around the world and how they differ. We also identified the position of the Prime/Greenwich Meridian and the different time zones around the world.

We then moved on to looking at climate change, it's causes and the impact it has on our world. We looked at ways we can live more sustainably and how we can support sustainability in the future. On our visit to Drax, we learned how electricity is generated. We took a tour of the station and learnt about the biomass domes, the cooling towers and the turbine hall.

In RE, we have continued to look at the Sikh faith. We identified the Sikh articles of faith known as the 5 K's and also the importance of the Langar (a community kitchen) in representing Sikh values.

In PE we have taken part in Fitness and Handball units and in Spanish we have been learning the vocabulary for school subjects and say what subjects we like and dislike at school.
