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EYFS - FS1 NEWS

This half term, has been a vey busy one. This terms learning has been based around our theme of 'Let's Explore'.

In Literacy we have been studying one of our favourite books. "Going on a Bear Hunt" by Michael Rosen. We have been retelling the story using our own story maps and designing our very own bear caves. We have loved creating our own pictures and paintings linked to the story.

Next, we were pirates and explored the seven seas creating wonderful ships and hats and telescopes in junk modelling and painting.

We have also explored the book 'Billy's Bucket' by Kes Grey and been imagining what we could find in the bucket. We have had some amazing drawings of mermaids and sharks to name just a few.

Then, we have been exploring superheroes and talked about who our favourite superhero is and what we want to be when we grow up.

In phonics, we have been working on segmenting and blending words orally, identifying rhyming words and making up new rhymes to our favourite nursery rhymes. We have been spotting sounds at the beginning of words and working on spotting syllables in words.

We have also been working hard at practising our letter formation and name writing ready for FS2.

We have also revisited how we wash our hands to get rid of germs and to stay nice and healthy.

In Maths, we have been practicing lots of subitising and number recognition as well as working with lots of 2D and 3D shapes and figuring our full and half full with capacity work.

FS1 have been amazing at practising for sports day and then were outstanding on the day. All the children loved showing off their skills and were fantastic sports men and women.

Everyone also really enjoyed 'Little City's' visit to FS1. We loved being builders, Doctors, Vets, Postmen and Women, Mechanics, Café Owners, Shop assistants, Beauticians, Hairdressers, Police and Firemen and the occasional bad guy. It was amazing!!

EYFS - FS2 NEWS

This half term we have enjoyed participating in lots of engaging activities linked to our theme 'Let's Explore'. This included a fantastic trip to the Butterfly House. The children enjoyed travelling on the coach – they were so well behaved! The children were keen to visit different parts of the venue – we found it very humid in the Butterfly House itself. We were amazed at the range of different butterflies we could see! We also loved to see a range of different animals including goats, meerkats, different types of birds and we even got to see a tortoise! The children loved exploring the adventure playground and having lunch on the big red bus!

We have loved reading a range of texts. We particularly enjoyed 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' – we have retold the story, talked about key events and spoken about the different characters. The children have then enjoyed learning about different types of bears e.g. Polar Bears, Pandas and Brown Bears. We have gained knowledge about different types of bears around the world. The children have been inspired to draw images of different bears and lots of us have written facts about them.

Our phonics skills have continued to improve. Lots of children are now able to read simple sentences independently. We are applying our phonics skills with increasing confidence to write independently. Also our maths skills continue to grow – children can now often be found writing numbers independently!

We engaged in a range of Sports Day activities. The children listened carefully and were able to confidently take part in each activity – cheering on their friends during each race.

YEAR 1 NEWS

This half term, Year 1's learning has been "Journeys and Adventures!'. In history we have been learning about significant people. Our focus has been on the lives of both Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong. To celebrate this, we took part in a fantastic history workshop where we learnt about why Christopher Columbus is remembered and how we know about his exploits through his detailed diary records. We were also introduced to life, clothing and materials used from the fifteenth century and got chance to investigate and handle reconstructed artefacts from the period.

In science, our focus has been changes in the environment as we go from Spring to Summer. We have also talked about staying safe in the sun to keep ourselves healthy and safe.

In computing we have been learning about data handling. We have been representing data in different ways and sorting data. We have also been practising using a mouse and keyboard to navigate a computer.

In Spanish our focus has been learning our shapes and numbers.

In PE we have been learning the skills and rules of striking and fielding. We have also had fun practising our athletics skills for sports day.

In RE, we have been focusing on Islam faith and special people. We began by discussing our own special person and what makes them special. We then learnt about what makes a significant person of faith special. We also listened to stories of significant people within Islam faith and acting these stories out through role play.

	CHRISTMAS CONCERT				
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This half term, year 3 have been learning about the Ancient Egyptians as part of their history work. They had a visit from Catherine, who did a wonderful workshop for the day with the children where they were able to learn about mummification, Egyptian games and different Pharaohs. The children were also able to share their leaning when making Egyptian masks in their parent session.

In maths, children have continued to focus on learning their times tables and developing the speed recall for these. They are good at checking their heat maps on garage mode and working on any that need improving. They also like to challenge each other (and myself) on multiplayer. The children have also learned about shape and time as part of their maths learning.

In PE, the children have enjoyed learning more about cricket and have developed the skills they need to play the game successfully, as well as learning the basic rules of the game. They understand how the boundary works and how they can score 4 or 6 as well as how they can use their fielding skills to prevent the other team getting these.

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YEAR 4 NEWS

This half term, our learning has been all about 'Water World'. As part of our learning, we visited the Ewden Water Treatment Centre and found out where our water comes from, how it is treated and how it ends up back in our taps. We have identified the stages of the water cycle and looked at why it is an important process for our planet. We have also looked at why we need water, how we use it and why water conservation is important. We compared water access in the UK to that in Kenya and discussed how limited water access causes huge problems in communities. We then looked at how water contributes to a sustainable future, the benefits to hydropower and how hydropower can be detrimental to the environment. In ICT, we have been looking at handling data and how we can use spreadsheets to organise information as well as use formulas to do calculations for us! In PE, we have been learning how to play rounders as well as looking at the roles of the bowler and the backstop.

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YEAR 5 NEWS

The Ancient Maya Civilisation

This half term year 5 have learnt in history about the Ancient Maya Civilisation. With this we have looked at when the civilisation began and which civilisations were in existence with in this time era. We have studied in depth with who they are as a civilisation and which Gods they worshiped and how this and religion was such an important factor for each city state. We discussed how the Maya ruins and temples tell us stories of what life would have been like and how the information we have on the Ancient Maya Civilisation was originally captured by an explorer called John Lloyd Stephens and the famous artist Frederick Catherwood, whom drew pictures of the ruins due to having no technology with in that time frame. We then moved on to look at the achievements of the Maya (including their number, writing and calendar systems), with finally looking at the theories behind the abandoned cities of the Ancient Maya.

During geography, we looked at mapping Central America and how once upon a time it was called Mesoamerica. We looked at the countries that the Ancient Maya people once lived and where some still reside today.

During computing we have spent time looking at creating media, using an ipad app called Stop Motion. We looked into the creation of how Wallace and Gromit was filmed and we have tried to recreate our own small clips of films using this technique.

During DT, the child have explored healthy eating and have taken part in creating a healthy Bolognese recipe. We looked at which ingredients we could use to make it as healthy as we could, but still making it enjoyable to eat.
