

FSI



CLASS TOPIC NEWS

YEAR 2

This half term Year 2 have loved learning about the Great Fire of London. On Monday 2nd December we invited parents in to join us for the afternoon where the children showed off their knowledge of Tudor houses and life in 1666. Then we all had a lovely time recreating our very own Tudor Houses with our grown ups.



YEAR 3

Year 3 have been looking at the topic of Ancient Egyptians over the past term. The children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about the Egyptians including the process of mummification, discovering the different Gods and Goddesses and writing about different Egyptian stories.

We had a particularly lovely parent session where the children were able to make Egyptian Death Masks. They all looked fab and everyone really enjoyed it, particularly the children. They are really proud of what they have been able to create. A big thank you again to all the parents who came to support.

YEAR 4 - I Am Warrior

This term, Year 4's topic has been 'I Am Warrior'. During this topic we have learnt about the Romans, Anglo Saxons and Vikings and their impact on Britain. We have located settlements in Britain and looked at how and why Hadrian's Wall was built. In history, we have developed our chronological knowledge of events from the Romans through to the Vikings. We have also looked at the sophisticated Roman road system and bathhouses that the Romans created. We have also learnt about what life would have been like in Anglo Saxon times.

Before half-term, parents were invited in to help us make Viking Long Boats. What a fantastic afternoon that was! The results were amazing! After the holiday, in the torrential rain, we ventured to the Jorvik Viking Centre, in York, where we learnt lots about what it would have been like to be a Viking. We also took part in a battle tactics workshop and had the opportunity to be archeologist where we unearthed various artifacts including Viking poo!



CLASS TOPIC NEWS

YEAR 5 - The Stone Age to the Iron Age

This term, Year 5 have been studying 'The Stone Age to the Iron Age'. During this they have learnt about prehistory, hunter gatherers, risks and assets of Stone Age life and how settlements were formed. The children realised how lucky they were in modern day life, and how times have really changed. Through the term the children learnt why some of the locations were chosen in geography, as well as mapping them.

During Autumn 2, the children in groups carefully planned and created sketches of their own settlements. The children then invited their parents into help construct small settlements. To finish off our afternoon, the children offered their parents cakes and buns to buy to help raise money for our school trip. The afternoon was very successful, (some of the parents even got very competitive).



YEAR 6


As part of our World at War topic, Year 6 have been learnt about life during World War II. We learned about many aspects of the war including the reasons why the war started and the countries involved. The children learned about the Sheffield Blitz and wrote newspaper reports about the bombings. We created our own propaganda posters encouraging people to grow their own food. Year 6 visited Kelham Island and took part in workshops about: evacuation, women in factories and the Home Front. We were also lucky enough to be visited by Meryl White, who taught us all about rationing during WWII.






During Black History Month, we learnt about Walter Tull, who was both a professional footballer and soldier during WWI, becoming the first black officer to lead white British soldiers into battle.

In Art, we learnt about different techniques of shading, tone and values. The children produced some fantastic pieces of work and have continued to use these skills in their artwork.





In Science, we have learnt about light and shadows, the circulatory system and with the help of Barnsley Football Club, we have learnt about a healthy diet and exercise.
